Dr. Gates earned his doctorate in public health (clinical preventive care) and a masters in nutrition from Loma Linda University.

In addition to lecturing internationally about lifestyle medicine, he has worked in medical group practice as a clinical specialist, as a research data analyst and communication consultant for the pharmaceutical industry, and as a research associate/epidemiologist at Cornell University under tutelage of Dr.T. Colin Campbell on the China-Cornell-Oxford Project (popularly known as the "China Health Study"), which has more recently been popularized in the movie Forks Over Knives.

Currently, Dr. Gates is employed as a professor at Southern Adventist University. He teaches health promotion and research methodology to masters-level nurses and biostatistics, epidemiology, environmental medicine, and nutritional therapeutics to doctoral-level nurse practitioners.

Over the last decade, several thousand clinical studies have evaluated the efficacy of natural strategies (i.e. dietary, environmental, psycho-social, and physical) in the treatment of heart disease, diabetes, and cancer.
